1. Occasion:

The blood donation camp was organized to mark the 15th Foundation Day of Sanjivani Multipurpose Foundation, an institution committed to the betterment of society through healthcare, education, and welfare initiatives. The camp was conducted in collaboration with Vaibhavilaxmi Blood Centre, Kolhapur, a reputed and NABH-accredited blood bank known for its ethical standards and state-of-the-art collection and preservation facilities.

5. Aims and Objectives:

The key objectives of organizing this blood donation camp were:

- To celebrate Foundation Day with a meaningful and humanitarian activity
- To create awareness about the importance of regular and safe blood donation
- To involve medical students in public health activities for experiential learning
- To address the growing need for safe and timely blood availability in local hospitals
- To inculcate values of service, empathy, and medical responsibility among students

6. Proceedings of the Camp:

The camp began at 10:00 AM after the formal inauguration ceremony.

A health screening of donors was done including hemoglobin level, blood pressure, and medical history check.

Proper protocols were followed to ensure hygiene and donor safety under the supervision of the medical team from Vaibhavilaxmi Blood Centre.

All donors were provided with refreshments post-donation and were observed for 15–20 minutes for any side effects.

Awareness posters and banners were displayed, and the student volunteers educated visitors about the eligibility and myths around blood donation.

7. Outcome of the Event:

A total of 50 eligible donors voluntarily donated blood during the camp.

Among these were staff members, students, and local well-wishers.

The donated blood will be processed and made available to critical patients through Vaibhavilaxmi Blood Centre.

The event helped build confidence among students and increased awareness in the college and surrounding community.

The donors expressed satisfaction with the smooth process and appreciated the hospitality.

The guest dignitaries applauded the efforts of the organizing team, especially the student volunteers, for their dedication.
